English

Animals on the Move

Children will explore the Big Question: Which animal makes the toughest migration? They will learn the skills of skimming and scanning. They will plan and write a chronological report based on a specific animal migration.

Ultimate Rap

Children will listen to raps and learn about the differences between raps and poetry. They will focus on poetic language as well as how raps are constructed. They will write and perform their raps with a beat accompaniment.

The children will read the book Can You See Me? Discussing important themes such as acceptance, friendship and identity.

Mathematics

Multiplication and Division

Children will identify multiples and factors and know and use the vocabulary of prime numbers, prime factors and composite numbers as well as recognising and using square numbers and cube numbers.

Fractions

Children will identify, name and write equivalent fractions, represented visually. They will recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert from one form to the other. They will also compare and order fractions. Children will learn to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator and denominators that are multiples of the same number.

Science

Forces

The children will recap their learning on gravity, then move on to thinking about when friction is helpful. They will learn about the effects of wind and water resistance. The children will also learn how levers, pulleys and gears help us.

History

Ancient Greeks
Children will learn about:

- Chronology through the significant periods of time for Ancient Greeks
- · Beliefs of the Ancient Greeks
- Comparison between the citystates of Athens and Sparta
- The influence of the Ancient Greeks on the modern world.

Geography

Study the location of countries of the world, including biomes and environmental regions.
Children will locate the world's countries using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia) and North and South America. Concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.

Art

Portraits

Children will:

- •Outline a portrait drawing with words creating interest
- •Try a variety of materials and compositions for the backgrounds of their drawings.
- •Create a successful print.
- •Create a self-portrait that aims to represent something about them.

PSHE

Celebrating difference
Children will explore culture and
cultural differences. They learn how to
be aware of their own feelings towards
people from different cultures. They
revisit bullying and discuss rumour
spreading and name-calling. They will
talk about happiness regardless of
material wealth and respecting other
people's cultures.

Gymnastics- Counter Balance and Counter Tension
Pupils will create sequences by consistently applying flow and challenging their creativity. Pupils will focus on the various ways they can construct the sequence and link the balances with movements.
